

Eugenie and her team of disciple-makers in Rwanda felt urged by the Lord to go and strengthen the disciples who is living on the border of these two countries. They used trauma counselling as a compassion ministry in order to engage with the people in those communities who are "harassed and helpless, like sheep without a Sheperd" (Mat. 9:36). All for the sake of introducing them to the Good Sheperd and to identify those who are ready to become His disciples.

We thank the Lord for filling His labourers with His *compassion* for the lost and using them as well as the hardship these people endured to draw them to Himself.

Through her efforts *six* Discovery Bible Study groups have been established of which *four* of these groups have already multiplied into new Discovery groups.
