Upcoming Opportunities

* Following Brother Ed Gross' recent visit, we are seeing encouraging growth in disciple-making opportunities across South Africa, in churches, groups, and CBMC leaders, responding to the

Great Commission.

*We continually invest weekly in core groups of faithful leaders within DGM network across SA, Rwanda, Uganda, Malawi, Zambia.

*Training recruits at Flock House Min in

Pta on 27–30 April.

*Ongoing seven-week training cycles on the *Habits of a Replicating Disciple*, equipping people from Randburg, Congo, and a multi-cultural group in Sunnyside.

*Monthly training at rehab centres in Boksburg continues in partnership with Amazing Graces.

*From 29 June - 25 July, travelling to Malawi and Zambia to strengthen DGM disciple-makers and facilitate training

near the Malawi-Mozambique border.

*On 16 – 19 April, we will be training leaders in Lukau, Groblersdal, and a group of leaders in Burgersfort.

*Plans are also underway to equip leaders in Lesotho,

seeking to reach 70 identified unreached communities.

*Later this year we plan to train theology students from across Africa at Back to the Bible Mission, Barberton.

Person of Peace keep opening up groups of people to the Gospel

Definition of a Person of Peace (Luke 10:1-12):

A Person of Peace is a person who is far from God, but open to the Gospel and willing to introduce their friends and family to the gospel.

A while back someone in the network met a person who was at that time still far from God, but open to him and to the gospel. As the friendship grew, so also did the person grow closer to the Lord. And the more He got to know God, the more he wanted his friends to also get to know Him. So much so that he has taken the disciple-maker to various different apartments in his block of flats, to share the gospel with the people he is acquainted with. At one of these apartments, they met a very hospitable Congolese man who became convinced that the disciple-maker must come and train the people in His Church to also become disciples, who make disciples. Since then we as a network have been invited to do a *seven-week disciple-making training* with this lovely group of believers, consisting of foreigners from various African countries. We trust that God will use these efforts to send out more Spirit empowered labourers into His harvest, in South-Africa and beyond!

*Over years we have seen those toddlers growing up as leaders in school.

*At the taxi rank we have gathered the young pupils, creche to Gr 2, waiting for the older ones to join in the taxis. We read Bible stories, sing, play, pray and care for one another. They love Jesus and appreciate our times together and they've learnt to clean up the park where they wait. Unfortunately, the taxi drivers prohibit the boys from joining us.

*Sometimes a young police officer, Seargent Minenhle Sithole visits and ministers to them, a true person of peace. This young police-man had recently been awarded for out-standing community involvement. →→

*A mother has asked me to teach her sons, ages 5 and 9, DBS. This is a new group, and we are already seeing the fruit. Caleb the oldest, has started reading his Bible for himself.

*Every engagement, toddler or adult, individual, group or school speaking is an opportunity to share the gospel and salvation – so many children, students and adults have received Jesus.

Local cop nabs national award

MTUNZINI'S Sergeant Minenhle Sithole was recognised recently at the SAPS National Excellence Awards 2026, making KZN proud. Sergeant Sithole received the Vispol Member of the Year award, Level 5-7, for his visible policing in the Mtunzini area.

Sgt Sithole is passionate about community development, as demonstrated by his active participation in the Drug Safety Committee, which visits schools at least four times a week, along with the Youth Desk, focusing on crimes related to extortion. He is also involved in Traditional Policing through regular visits to tribal courts, addressing stock theft and GBV. Often conducted over weekends, Sgt Sithole continues to prioritise

community outreach initiatives, primarily the Raising Upstanding Adults camp programme, which promotes agricultural education and farming among young boys. Sgt Sithole is also active in community and farmers' meetings, leading rural safety operations, including roadblocks, school awareness programmes, and ensuring compliance of liquor outlets and taverns.

Faith in Action: Three Widows Bring Hope and Transformation to Gingindlovu

Gingindlovu – In a quiet but powerful movement of faith, three widowed women are bringing hope, unity, and spiritual renewal to communities across Gingindlovu.

Sandra Perumal, Lora Rajakumar and Grace Muniappen

Serving as volunteers with Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF), the trio has devoted their lives to sharing the Good News with both children and adults. Their weekly outreach is both structured and far-reaching, including eight Good News Clubs, Monday assemblies at local high schools, and Wednesday assemblies at primary schools, where creative object lessons are used to communicate biblical truths in practical ways.

Beyond the classroom, their ministry continues to grow through Discovery Bible Study (DBS) groups held on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Sundays. These sessions have drawn 23 regular participants who gather to seek understanding, ask questions, and deepen their faith together.

Prayer remains at the heart of their work. Each Sunday, they host prayer sessions focused on teaching others how to pray and encouraging a deeper dependence on the Holy Spirit. In addition, monthly prayer walks have become a key outreach initiative, allowing the women to engage directly with the community—offering prayer, building relationships, and sharing messages of hope. Despite facing occasional resistance, the women remain steadfast in their calling.

“We trust God to lead us every step of the way,” they shared. “Even when challenges come, we know He is with us.”

Their mission is rooted in a desire to see love and unity within the Body of Christ, as well as lasting transformation in the lives of those they encounter. And that transformation is already visible.
